SUBJECT: Working session January 9 to establish key change categories for summit

consideration; 10 a.m.-3 p.m., IPS office, Jamaica Plain, Boston

It's time to focus and launch outreach for the May 3-5 Rules Change Summit.

The summit is an initiative of an ad-hoc Rules Change Project Working Group,¹ Our project codirector -- Scott Klinger of the Washington-based Institute for Policy Studies -- <u>will be Boston</u> for the day on Wednesday Jan. 9 as we hone categories for change consideration. Please join us and help!

We'll gather from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the IPS' Boston office at 30 Germania St., Building L, (the "Brewery Complex") in the Jamaica Plain section of Boston. <u>Directions for transit and driving area at the bottom of this note</u>. Here's the agenda:

 Sift down to a maximum of five key, broad categories for policy or behavior change. We'll be working from this list: http://tinyurl.com/rules-change-categories

Categories which don't make the cut will still be on our agenda, but as a practical matter will not be featured in pre-convening work or action planning.

2. Identify category-specific individuals and groups capable of leading pre-event preparation of specific mobilization and change-producing activities in the key, broad categories.

- 3. List and prioritize desirable game or rule changes sought for each key broad category. What's our best-possible outcome(s)?
- 4. Review and add to list of "delegates" to be invited to the Summit List example: http://tinyurl.com/rules-change-delegates (add notes)
- 5. Identify resources needed to ensure competent event management and diverse attendance; frame appropriate funding requests.

We'll also propose and discuss a <u>draft news release</u> announcing the summit.

Key points we're striving for throughout this pre-event process:

- Create a meeting place for category leaders to share agendas and strategies
- Seek political and socio-economic diversity among invited delegates
- Prefer inviting delegates with demonstrated ability to inspire
- Advance specific actions pre-event for discussion, modification and consensus
- Include change strategies which Washington can follow rather than having to lead
- Measure Rules Change success of summit by impact, not size or breadth

There's parking on some of the side streets, and a parking lot for brewery tenants and customers (allow some time for this -- it can get full). We are also a five-minute walk from the Stony Brook T stop on the Orange Line. Our Building L is a two-story, square-ish brick building attached to the Sam Adams brewery. If you follow signs for the Brewery Tour, Building L is immediately to the LEFT of the brewery tour main entrance/waiting area. There is an IPS (Institute for Policy Studies) sign on the door. Enter and go up the stairs to the second floor. We're right there!
